These services and supports may include diagnostic and evaluation services, outpatient treatment, emergency services (24 hours a day, 7 days a week), case management, intensive home-based services, day treatment, respite care, therapeutic foster care, and services that will help young people make the transition to adult systems of care. Systems of care are developed on the premise that the mental health needs of children, adolescents, and their families can be met within their home. school, and community environments. These systems are also developed around the principles of being child-centered, familydriven, strength-based, and culturally competent and involving interagency collaboration.
